

Course Description

The SIT40416 Certificate IV in Hospitality is a qualification that reflects the role of skilled operators who use a broad range of hospitality service, sales or operational skills combined with supervisory skills and sound knowledge of industry operations to plan, monitor and evaluate the work of team members. They operate independently or with limited guidance from others, and use discretion to solve non-routine problems. To achieve a Certificate IV in Hospitality, 21 units must be completed.

Entry Requirements:

This qualification is only offered via RPL (recognition of prior learning) and skills assessment process. Candidates must have at least 3 years' experience in the relevant hospitality field.
